Wordsworth Editions Ltd has reprinted a number of books in its Wordsworth Reference series. These are affordable paperbacks (\$4-\$6 range), which make available many works which have been out of print for some years. These are large-format paperbacks and for reprints surprisingly easy to read with large type and generous white space. (The Dunkling and Wright is an unfortunate exception; its double-columned pages are set in what looks like 5 point type).

Recently published by George Wahr is the twelfth edition of John S. Kenyon's *American Pronunciation*, edited by Donald M. Lance and Stewart A. Kingsbury. Copyright 1994, first printing June 1997. Pp. xxix-410.

The first edition of *American Pronunciation* appeared in 1924. Reprinted and revised many times since, the twelfth edition is enlarged by the inclusion of an introduction and a 30-page survey of "Variation in American English" by Donald M. Lance and an 80-page "Spectrographic Analysis of English Phonemes and Allophones" by Donald M. Lance and Stephen M. Howie.

This is a welcome updating of a classic work on American English. Lance and Kingsbury have done a remarkable job of bringing Kenyon's early and mid twentieth century text into the 1990s. The addenda chapters provide especially useful insights into the phonology of contemporary American English and should be read first.
