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**Sheila Embleton** is a Professor of Linguistics, York University, Toronto, Canada. She is currently Past President of both the Canadian Society for the Study of Names and the American Name Society. Her main areas of scholarly interest, other than onomastics, are historical linguistics, sociolinguistics, dialectology, and statistical applications in linguistics.

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**Donald M. Lance**, Professor *Emeritus*, taught in the English Department at the University of Missouri from 1969 to 1994. His publications include articles on Spanish-English bilingualism, American dialectology, and pedagogical linguistics, and he was an editor of *American Pronunciation*, by John. S. Kenyon, 12th ed. enlarged (Ann Arbor: Wahr, 1994). He has been active in the American Name Society, the American Dialect Society, the Missouri Folklore Society, and the Council of Geographic Names Authorities in the United States.

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**Lucie A. Möller** works as chief researcher at the Human Sciences Research Council in Pretoria, South Africa. She is a member of the International Council of Onomastic Sciences, the American Name Society and the Names Society of Southern Africa, of which she is secretary/treasurer and serves on the editorial board. She is the author or co-author of a number of books, articles and reports on names. Dr. Möller serves on the United Nations Group of Experts on Geographical Names (UNGEGN) and has represented South Africa twice.

**Alan Rayburn** is a geographer who writes and speaks about Canadian toponymy. Most of his career with the Canadian government was served with the secretariat of the Canadian Permanent Committee on Geographical Names, of which he was its Executive Secretary from 1973 to 1987. He was president of the Canadian Society for the Study of Names from 1979-82, and president of the American Name Society in 1985.

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
