# Women's Marital Surname Change by Bride's Age and Jurisdiction of Residence: A Replication

On the 1<sup>st</sup> and 27<sup>th</sup> of January 2023, the author alerted the Editor-in-Chief that two mistakes appear in Figure 2 of the originally published, author-approved, version of this manuscript. The first error appeared within the line graph where data is provided to show the interaction between women's median/full-time/salaried income with Gini and premarital surname retention or hyphenation. In the original version of the graph, the red line was incorrectly labeled as "High (+1 S.D.) Men's Median FT/Salaried income". The correct label should have been "High (+1 S.D.) Women's Median FT/Salaried income". The second error appeared in the caption underneath Figure 2. According to the author, the phrase "only where state Gini high" should have been "only where state Gini low". These errors have been corrected in the manuscript which was released online on the 1<sup>st</sup> of February 2023 by the current publisher of NAMES, University of Pittsburgh. The corrected version of the manuscript may be downloaded from the NAMES archives. In February 2023, the previous publisher of NAMES, Taylor and Francis, was alerted about these errors and requested to update their archives with the corrected manuscript.
