THE MARY GLIDE GOETHE PRIZE

An annual prize of one hundred dollars has been made available through the generosity of Charles M. Goethe of Sacramento, California, a charter member of the American Name Society, for the best original contribution in name research.

In order to stimulate research in onomatology in the younger generation the prize will be rewarded to persons under thirty-five years of age, or to those who received their Ph.D. after 1948. A paper of any type may be submitted for consideration as long as it is an original contribution to some phase of onomatology. Doctor's or master's dissertations or term papers are acceptable.

Members of the editorial board of the American Name Society are the judges of the contest. If possible, papers should be submitted in multiple copies. The judges reserve the right to postpone the reward if no paper of acceptable merit is submitted.

The award-winning contribution becomes the property of the American Name Society. The winner is entitled to one half of the royalties which may result from the publication of the prize-winning article or monograph.
